TivoliVredenburg

The WASBE2017 concerts will take place in the Great Hall of TivoliVredenburg with two daily concerts of wind ensembles from all around the world.

TivoliVredenburg is an architectural wonder in the heartland of The Netherlands: a musical city within a city. Right in the center of Utrecht only a stone's throw away of the Central Station and the lively old town. The venue offers a podium to all musical worlds: classical, pop, dance, jazz, and everything in between.

TivoliVredenburg offers not just one, but five unique concert halls under one roof, catering to all possible events, from concerts to TV recordings. The five differing rooms of the venue can accommodate a combined total of up to 7.500 people. Yet as grand and overwhelming the whole site may be, each separate room is marked by its own intimate and personal atmosphere. One of the facility's unique features provided in each room, is that the speaker or performer on stage will never be more than 20 meters away from the public!

The five halls are designed by four different architects, what makes the recently renovated building unique in the world. The Great Hall (Grote Zaal) is located on the ground floor and has 1717 seats. The interior of the hall has been kept intact

as far as possible, because of its good quality. It has been equipped with new chairs, but the acoustics and character of the hall have remained.

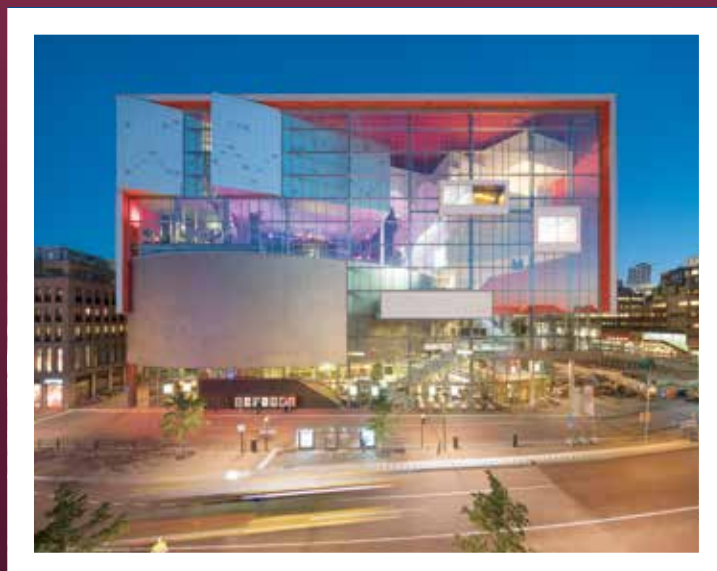

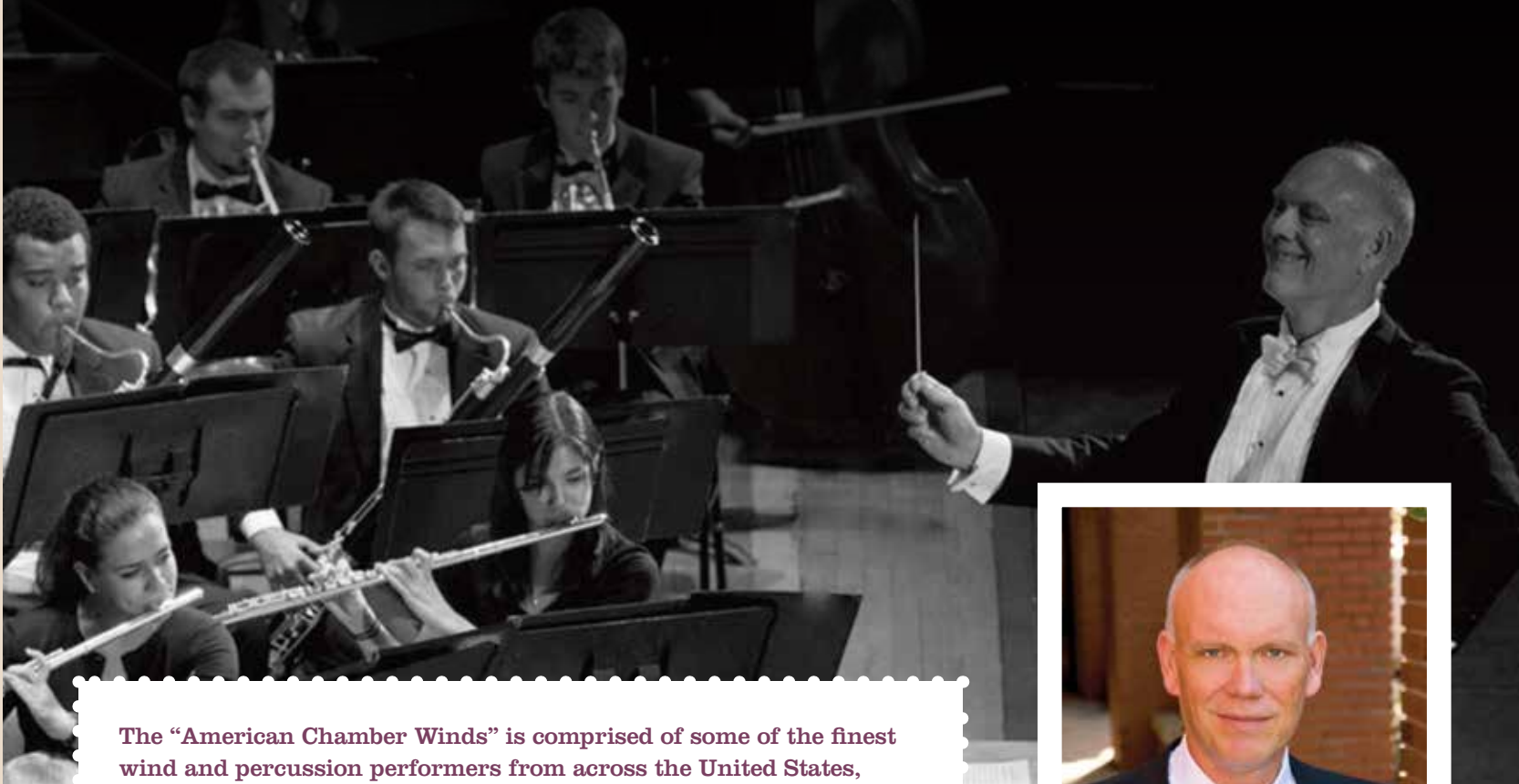

American Chamber Winds



The “American Chamber Winds” is comprised of some of the finest wind and percussion performers from across the United States, and is very much in demand for performances worldwide. It was founded in Skien, Norway in July 1983, by conductor David Waybright and Stanley D. Hettinger. The concept for the ensemble grew out of impromptu concerts given around the Skien area and in conjunction with the first World Conference of the World Association for Symphonic Bands and Ensembles (WASBE). It led to the establishment of an ensemble with instrumentation comprised of standard harmoniemusik octet with additional pairs of orchestral instruments, including piano and percussion. The touring and recording ensemble has been featured on several published recordings and has given concerts in the United States, England, France, Italy, and Brazil.

Conductor David A. Waybright is currently Director of Bands at the University of Florida, where he holds the rank of professor and is the head of the conducting area. He directs the wind symphony and supervises the band program and the graduate and undergraduate conducting curricula. Dr. Waybright is in demand as a guest conductor and clinician with wind bands, orchestras, and choirs, and has appeared in that capacity in most of the 50 states and throughout Europe, Asia, and Australia.

Guest soloist Joseph Alessi is an active soloist, recitalist, and chamber music performer. He was appointed Principal Trombone of the New York Philharmonic in the spring of 1985 and made his solo debut in April 1990. Mr. Alessi has been a guest soloist with multiple orchestras and ensembles and has participated in numerous festivals all over the world. In 2002, Mr. Alessi was awarded an International Trombone Association Award for his contributions to the world of trombone music and trombone playing.

The Royal Netherlands Music Organization (KNMO) continues to expand and develop. Established three years ago by the merger of the KNFM and VNM, this national federation exists to promote music-making throughout the Netherlands and to represent the joint interests of its affiliated societies, bands, orchestras and musicians. The KNMO devotes particular attention to the social position of amateur arts, to cultural education and participation, and to innovation within the amateur music sector.

The KNMO serves various target groups, including wind orchestras, brass bands, marching bands and show corps (majorettes and baton-twirling groups). To these can now be added amateur string orchestras, united under the banner of the FASO and the members of the Dutch Organization for Accordion and Harmonics (NOVAM). Talks are to be held with various other organizations with a view to closer cooperation or full partnership. In short, the KNMO continues to grow and mature. See also www.knmo.nl.

Services provided by the KNMO include:

- Legal advice.
- Organizational support and training for administrators, often in association with SESAM Academie, Apeldoorn.
- Production of new standard theory exams.
- The Repertoire Information Centre (RIC) evaluates the existing repertoire and encourages its expansion.
- The KNMO organizes or facilitates various competitions and events, including the Open Dutch Fanfare Championship, the Open Dutch Wind Orchestra Championship, the Dutch Brass Band Championship, the Open Dutch Show Corps Championship and the National Youth Festival in Vlissingen.

National lobbying:

- The KNMO has helped to ensure that amateur music and music education are included in the election manifestos of four national political parties.
- The KNMO has secured the continuity of public funding for music education.
- The KNMO remains closely involved in the further development of cultural education in the Netherlands under the auspices of the Ministry of Education, Culture and Science.
- Through the efforts of the KNMO, the National Centre of Expertise for Cultural Education and Amateur Arts (LKCA) has increased its focus on the practical application of its research within the sector.
- The KNMO has inspired several regional authorities to place music education and the role of amateur music societies on their agendas.

Notable activities in recent years include:

- Organization of the first European Championship for Wind Orchestras (ECWO2016).
- Organization of the national KNMO conference.
- Establishment of the KNMO Knowledge Centre for Youth and Education.
- Revival of the National Youth Wind Orchestra (NJHO) for which open auditions are to be held.
- Live streaming of concerts and events via Blaasmuziektv.nl.

Koninklijke Militaire Kapel 'Johan Willem Friso'



The Royal Netherlands Army Band 'Johan Willem Friso' (KMKJWF, 2005) is carrying on the traditions of the former Royal Military Band (1829) and the Johan Willem Friso Band (1819). This professional concert band has as its main task the musical accompaniment of military and state ceremonies and official receptions held by His Majesty King Willem Alexander, heads of state and ambassadors.

In addition, the KMKJWF also gives concerts to promote good relations between the Royal Netherlands Army and its environment. In the event of official ceremonies and during the annual Netherlands National Tattoo, the band joins forces with the Regimental Brass Ensemble of the Grenadiers and Rifles. On these occasions the members of the band display the ceremonial dress of the Grenadier Guards. The uniforms are best known for the bearskins, but also include the Turkish crescents, elaborate percussion instruments traditionally used by military bands. They were a gift given to the former Royal Military Band by Queen Mother Emma in 1901.

Conductor Tijmen Botma is currently chief conductor of the KMKJWF, Fanfare Orchestra Psalm 150 Dinxperlo and the northern Dutch Concert Orchestra. He is also professor Conducting for Concert Fanfare Brassband at the Prince Claus Conservatory in Groningen and regularly serves as a guest conductor and jury member at various music competitions.

Guest Soloist is Jörgen van Rijen, principal trombonist of the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra. He is much in demand as a soloist with a special commitment to promoting his instrument, developing new repertoire for the trombone and bringing the existing repertoire to a broader audience. Jörgen has won various prizes, including first prizes at the international trombone competitions of Toulon and Guebwiller and the Netherlands Music Prize in 2004, the highest distinction in the field of music.

The symphony wind orchestra of the Swiss Army Band is one of the world's best wind orchestras. Under the direction of Major Philippe Monnerat top Swiss musicians do their military service in this elite formation. In intensive practice sessions a demanding program is worked out. The brilliant tone and interpretative culture of the orchestra is recognized internationally.

Approximately 60 musicians dedicate their skills to top-level classical and contemporary wind orchestra compositions and transcriptions. Apart from gala concerts in Switzerland and abroad, the orchestra performs primarily at international congresses and seminars, where it is also conducted by international guest conductors.

Conductor Major Philippe Monnerat, born in 1967, obtained his orchestra diploma at the Conservatory in Basel. He studied the trumpet with Mario Populin and Eduard Tarr and conducting with Felix Hauswirth. Afterwards, he consolidated his studies in Paris with Pierre Thibaud. In 1996, he won a prize at the Swiss Conductors' Competition in Baden. Major Philippe Monnerat has been working at the Centre of Competence for Military Bands since 1999, today he is head of training support. From 2007 to 2013 he was in charge of conducting the Swiss Army Brass Band. In 2013, Philippe Monnerat became conductor of the Symphonic Wind Orchestra. In his free time, he conducts the Suberg- Grossaffoltern Music Association.

Irish Symphonic Wind Orchestra



The Irish Symphonic Wind Orchestra (ISWO) was established in January 2014. Its founding members, Keith Kelly and Barbara Dowling, had heard Johan de Meij's Symphony No.1 "The Lord of the Rings", and longed to play it with a group of high caliber players. They decided to call friends and fellow musicians to see if they could generate some interest, and within 24 hours of their idea going public, over 80 top musicians from all over Ireland and further afield had signed up to take part. It quickly became clear that musicians were very excited at the prospect of performing exceptional wind band music at a very high level, and so a full weekend workshop was organized. In January 2014, under the baton of Liam Daly, ISWO gave its first public performance. The Irish Symphonic Wind Orchestra had been born.

Conductor Liam Daly has been involved in music since the age of 9. After completing a Diploma in Advanced Music Studies, a LTCL Performance Diploma and a BA MUS, Liam took up a commission with the Irish Defence Forces in 1989 and the Australian Defence Forces in 2004. He filled several positions as Officer Commanding and Musical Director and was involved in teaching a youth orchestral music program at Darwin University and directed the Darwin Symphony Orchestra. Since returning to Ireland in 2008, Liam has been in demand with a number of varied and challenging roles, as a brass and theory teacher as well as working extensively with youth bands, wind ensembles, concert bands, brass bands, choral societies and orchestras. After a two-year tenure as the principal conductor of the ISWO from its establishment in 2014 to 2016, Liam is delighted to return this year as a special guest conductor.

Banda Municipal de Bilbao (1895) is integrated into BilbaoMusika, a local autonomous organization in charge of the management of the Municipal School of Music and municipal music bands. Performances of the Banda Municipal de Bilbao include official ceremonies and popular festivities and concerts in venues such as Azkuna Zentroa, Arenal Bandstand and the Euskalduna Conference Centre. The latter has been the stage for performances with multiple renowned guest conductors, soloists and ensembles. The Banda Municipal de Bilbao has released fourteen records and has delivered performances throughout the whole Spanish territory.

José Rafael Pascual Vilaplana is now in charge of this wind band that is already older than a century. He started his musical studies with euphonium and piano. Later on, he studied Conducting of Wind Bands with Jan Cober and Eugene Corporon, and Orchestral Conducting in Wien with Karl Österreich, Yuji Yuhasa and Hans Graf and also in Slovenia with Georges Pehlivanian. Pascual Vilaplana performed as guest conductor with several bands in Spain as well as in other countries all over the world. As a composer, Pascual Vilaplana has produced works for wind band, as well as choral and chamber music, commissioned by many festivals and prestigious soloist. Next to that, he teaches conducting and serves as artistic director in summer courses. His awards and merits include: First Prize “Gold Baton” of the WMC Kerkrade (1997); First Prize of the EBBA in Birmingham (UK, 2000); Euterpe Prix Medal for Wind Bands Conducting and Composition by Valencian Federation of Wind Bands (2004); National Prix Medal of Music “I. Morales Nieva” of the Festival de Música de Castilla La Mancha (2010).

Saratoga High School ensembles have performed at regional, state, and national conferences. Michael Boitz is the Performing Arts Department Chair at Saratoga High School, where he is in his 19th year of teaching Instrumental Music. Founded in 2003, the Orchestra Fiati di Valle Camonica is one of the leading wind orchestras in the Italian musical scene, formed by approximately 60 players. The Orchestra prides itself with important results at national and international festivals, winner of the 1st category (2007), superior (2011) and excellence category (2016) at "Flicorno d'Oro" international contest in Riva del Garda (Italy), and the Excellence Category (2012) at "Vallée d'Aoste" international contest (Italy). The orchestra hosted many important conductors and soloists from all over the world.

Since its foundation, the orchestra is conducted by Denis Salvini. Horn player and soloist, he has studied conducting with Ronald Johnson, Lorenzo della Fonte and Douglas Bostock. Since 2006 he holds the conducting instructor position at the Brescia Band Center and works as guest conductor, teacher and clinician in Italy, Europe and the United States.

Since 2000 Devid Ceste is second trombone in the Orchestra Sinfonica Nazionale della RAI (Italian national TV broadcast orchestra) and guest player for various ensembles. Symphonic Wind Orchestra St. Michael of Thorn



Symphonic Wind Orchestra St. Michael of Thorn was founded in 1863 and since then has developed into an orchestra of international fame, embracing both trained amateur instrumentalists and musicians with a professional background. The orchestra performed at international festivals such as the Festival for Modern Wind Music in Uster (Switzerland) and the first European Wind Band Festival in London and has represented The Netherlands on several occasions on conferences of the World Association for Symphonic Bands and Ensembles (WASBE). Through its innovative and diverse programming, Symphonic Wind Orchestra St. Michael has received countless prizes in national and international music competitions. For example, the orchestra has won the top musical award at the Kerkrade World Music Contest three times.

The cooperation between conductor Ivan Meylemans and the Symphonic Wind Orchestra St. Michael dates from 1996 when he started performing as trombone soloist with the orchestra on several occasions. Since 2013, he has been the chief conductor of the orchestra. As a trombone soloist, he won many national and international music competitions. For 12 years, he was a trombone soloist for the Concertgebouw Orchestra where he also assisted conductor Mariss Jansons. As a guest conductor Meylemans has worked with major orchestras in Europe and Asia.

Guest soloists are Jörgen van Rijen and Alexander Verbeek, principal trombonists of – respectively - the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra and the Rotterdam Philharmonic Orchestra. Jörgen van Rijen is a specialist on both the modern and baroque trombone. He has won various prizes, including The Netherlands Music Prize in 2004, the highest distinction in the field of music. Alexander Verbeek studied trombone at the Rotterdam Conservatory and followed masterclasses with Michel Becquet, Bart van Lier, Christian Lindberg and Victor Sumerkin. He is one of the founders of the New Trombone Collective, principal lecturer at Rotterdam Conservatory and actively involved in many musical and educational projects.

Banda Municipal de Barcelona

The Barcelona Symphonic Band (Banda Municipal de Barcelona, BMB) was founded as an orchestral band in 1886 in line with a centuries-old tradition of musical formations which since the Middle Ages, under the name of 'Municipal music', had brought an air of solemnity to official events and City Council processions or even played serenades. In 1886 the Barcelona City Council regularised municipal music which brought the music of the great composers within reach of the lower classes.

The band today, with its 56 musicians, has its headquarters in L'Auditori de Barcelona. It wants to showcase premières and performances of works by contemporary composers, introduce the public to the original repertory for symphonic band and produce a varied and popular programme with the object of bringing music closer to the general public.

Conductor Salvador Brotons was born in Barcelona into a family of musicians. He obtained advanced qualifications in flute, composition and orchestral conducting at the Conservatori Superior de Música de Barcelona. In 1985 he was awarded a Fullbright scholarship and moved to the United States, where he took a Doctorate in Music at the Florida State University.

As a composer, he has written more than 130 works, mainly for orchestra and chamber orchestra. He has received 16 prizes for composition, such as the Premio Nacional de España (1977) for his *Quatre peces per a cordes* (Four pieces for strings), the Premi Jove d'Or (1980) and the Premi Ciutat de Barcelona for his *Primera simfonia* (First symphony). In 2002 he received the Florida State University Alumni Award for his professional achievements. Since September 2008 he has been music director of the Banda Municipal de Barcelona.

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Banda Sinfónica Portuguesa



Located in Porto, a Banda Sinfónica Portuguesa (Portuguese Symphonic Band, BSP) had its presentation concert on January 1, 2005. Since then, BSP has recorded six CDs, all of them with the inclusion of at least one Portuguese work. BSP promotes the presentation of talented national and international soloists. Some presentations also include the participation of several choirs of the city of Porto. Other aims of BSP are the educational initiative to organise Instrument Masterclasses and Band Management Programmes with renowned artistic merit teachers and prestigious conductors, such as Jan Cober, Douglas Bostock, José Rafael Pascual Vilaplana, Eugene Corporon and Alex Schillings. In April 2008, BSP won the first prize at the II International Contest of Bands of La Senia (Spain), in the first section, and in October 2011 it won the 60th anniversary edition of the World Music Contest in Kerkrade in the top category (Concert Division), with the highest score of all editions.

Conductor Francisco Ferreira is in charge of the artistic direction of BSP since its founding. He is known for his multidisciplinary artistic career. Ferreira holds a degree in Saxophone with the highest scores and directed numerous formations of wind and percussion from all over the world. He currently works as the Headmaster of Academia de Música de Costa Cabral, Porto and is often invited to join juries of national and international competitions of saxophone and bands.

Guest Soloist Henk van Twillert is an internationally renowned saxophonist (specialising in the baritone saxophone) with an inexhaustible passion for music. He graduated with distinction from the Sweelinck Academy of Music in Amsterdam, where he also founded the Amsterdam Saxophone Quartet (1979) with Bart Kok. The quartet played an important role in the popularisation of classical chamber music and the intermingling of other musical genres, and has performed all over the world.

Brass Band Schoonhoven



The Brass Band Schoonhoven was founded in 1921 as a fanfare band and transformed into a brass band in 1971. Between 1995 and 1998, the band made a remarkable progression, and was promoted from the second division to the highest level: The Championship Division. From 2010 to 2014 Brass Band Schoonhoven was crowned Dutch champion for four times in a row. Internationally, the French and Belgian Open Brass Band Championships were won, together with five Euro Brass Contests. Because of their many successes, Brass Band Schoonhoven was appointed cultural ambassador of the city of Schoonhoven, famous for its silver works. In 2016, the band reclaimed their Dutch title and will perform during the WASBE conference as reigning champions.

Brass Band Schoonhoven very frequently performs on various concerts at home and abroad. In 2003 and 2005, the band travelled to South Africa for two concert tours, and gave lessons to young musicians and conductors in the town ships of Cape Town. Ivan Meylemans is chief conductor of Brass Band Schoonhoven since January 2017. He is one of the most exciting conductors to emerge in Europe recent years and currently chief conductor of the Zeeland Orchestra in Middelburg, the Symphonic Orchestra of the LUCA School of Arts in Leuven, the wind band "St. Michael" Thorn, world champion fanfare "Kempenbloei" Achel and Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra Brass. As a guest conductor, Ivan Meylemans has worked with major symphonic orchestras in Europe and the rest of the world.

Soloist Robbert Vos is euphonium player in the Royal Marine Band of The Netherlands, solo euphonium player of Brass Band Schoonhoven and Sterling Virtuoso Artist. He is a frequently invited guest player and soloist around Europe and regularly asked to give low-brass clinics. His trips took him to Norway, Scotland, Wales, Chicago and Hong Kong.

Gelders Fanfare Orchestra

The Gelders Fanfare Orchestra (GFO) is one of Holland's most renowned fanfare orchestras and consists of about sixty-five enthusiastic musicians. The GFO performs in the premier league of wind orchestras: the Concert-division. For a large part its members are advanced amateurs, but music students and professional musicians play in the orchestra as well. The Fanfare is an orchestral genre which is typical for The Netherlands and Belgium, and the players of the GFO just love the sound of this type of orchestra.

The GFO has dedicated itself to promoting the fanfare orchestra in its most original form. In addition, the orchestra pursues the introduction of innovative elements within the fanfare music, for example by providing composition assignments and playing works by new and upcoming composers. The orchestra performs concerts regularly, and participates in numerous musical projects and final exams of conservatory students. The orchestra also organizes the annual "Young Soloists Project", where promising young musicians (8-18 years old) are invited to an audition. The winner is given the opportunity to perform a solo during a gala-concert of the Gelders Fanfare Orchestra.

Conductor Erik van de Kolk (1985) began his musical training in his hometown Elspeet. At the age of 16 he started his studies at the Conservatory in Zwolle, as a percussionist. Since 2005, Erik studied Conducting with Alex Schillings at the Royal Conservatory in The Hague and attended conducting classes with Ivan Meylemans and Jan Cober. He finished his studies Cum Laude in 2012. In 2011, he won the 5th European Conducting Competition in Montreux (Switzerland), where he was elected 'Best Conductor' by both the orchestra, the audience and the jury. In the same year, Erik started conducting the Gelders Fanfare Orchestra. Over the years, he was invited to conduct professional orchestras like the Fanfarekorps Koninklijke Landmacht "Bereden Wapens", the Koninklijke Militaire Kapel "Johan Willem Friso", and the Police Orchestra Böblingen (Germany).

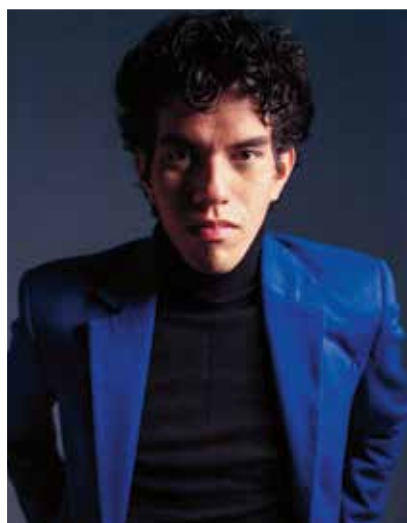

Simon Bolivar Youth Symphonic Band of Venezuela



The Simon Bolivar Youth Symphonic Band of Venezuela (SBYSBV) is an example of musical excellence, perseverance and dedication, which in a short time became one of the greatest exponents of the National System of Youth and Children's Orchestras of Venezuela (El Sistema), created by Jose Antonio Abreu. The SBYSBV was formed in 2005 in the Conservatory of Music Simon Bolivar by the initiative of Valdemar Rodriguez and Jesus Ignacio Perez Perazzo.

From its debut, it developed a remarkable artistic growth, offering numerous concerts in the most important theaters of Venezuela, quickly placing itself at the forefront of the movement of wind ensembles on the continent. In 2013, the SBYSBV made its debut at the prestigious Theater Chatelet in Paris, France. The SBYSB also performed at festivals such as the International Music Band Contest in Valencia, Spain; the World Music Contest in Kerkrade, The Netherlands; and the III International Congress of Music for Bands in Medellin, Colombia.

The SBYSBV has been conducted by conductors of great prestige, including Thomas Clamor, Antonio Saiote, Ferrer Ferrán, Jonathan Cohler, Johan de Meij, Timothy Reynish, Alfredo Rugeles, Diego Guzmán, among others.

The year 2008 meant for the SBYSBV a new stage, when Sergio Rosales, assumed as Music Director. He received his first piano and violin lessons at a very early age, then joined El Sistema, starting as a violinist. He studied orchestral conducting with Alfredo Rugeles and Rodolfo Saglimbeni, and participated in international courses of orchestral conducting, highlighting the Canford Summer School of Music in the UK. He is currently one of the main representatives of the new and brilliant generation of talented conductors trained under the tutelage of Jose Antonio Abreu within El Sistema.

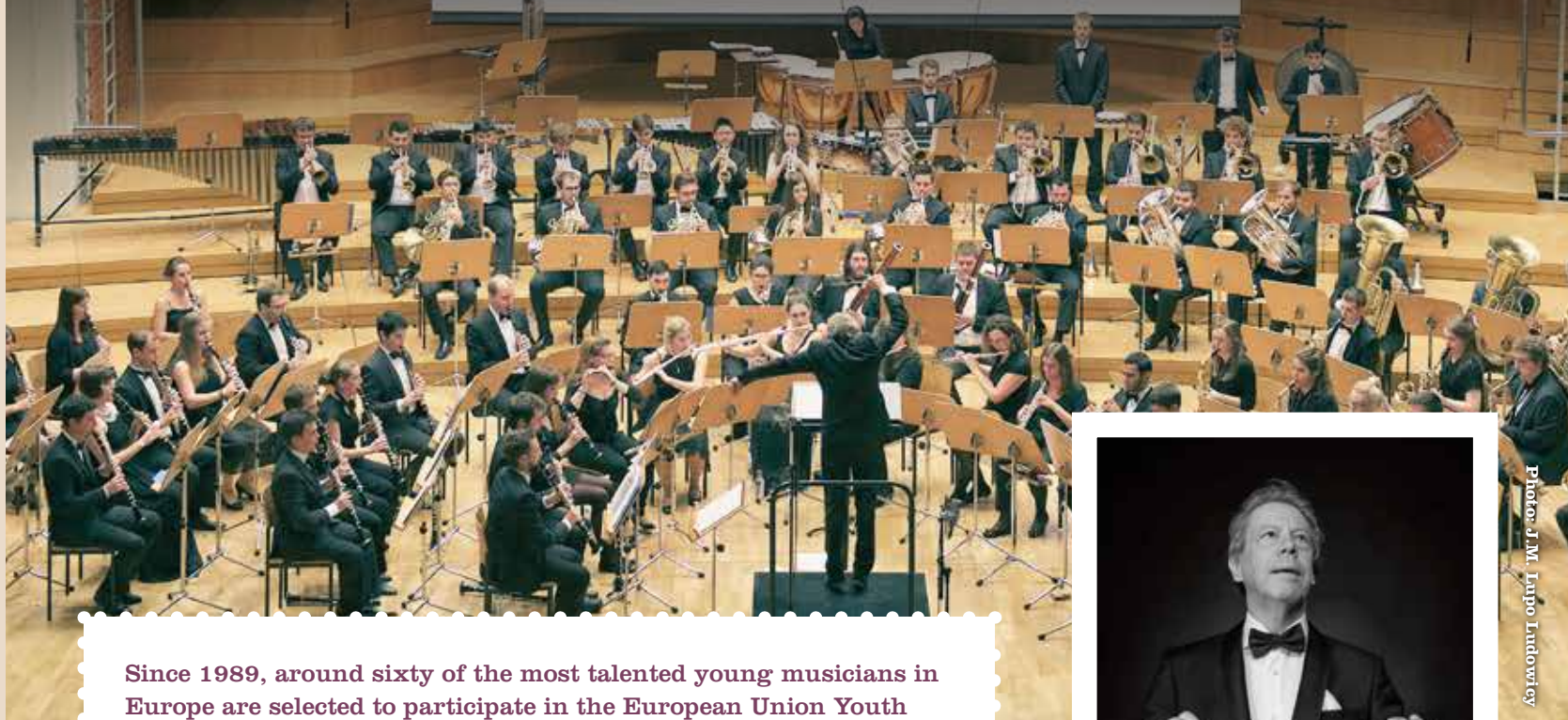

This high-level ensemble gained over the years a true recognition throughout Europe for its cultural and educational value: in addition to the promotion of young talented musicians, this orchestra meeting also aims to support musical expertise in the field of wind orchestra and orchestra conducting, stimulate the dissemination of original compositions for wind orchestras and promote the European spirit and cultural openness through the discovery of other countries and through the contact with musicians from different cultures and countries.

Over the years, the working sessions and concert tours have led the EUYWO to Luxembourg, Germany, Belgium, Spain, France, Greece, Italy, The Netherlands and Portugal. Since 2009, the EUYWO has a close collaboration with the prestigious international music festival WMC (World Music Contest) in Kerkrade, The Netherlands, recognized worldwide as the major international event of music for wind instruments.

The EUYWO reorganizes every two years under the direction of worldwide renowned Dutch conductor Jan Cober (since 1998). He conducts all over the world, from Portugal to Australia, from Spain to Japan, and was the artistic director of the ISEB, institute for conducting in Trento (Italy), professor at the conservatory in Maastricht (The Netherlands), as well as a leader of master classes and clinics. His method created conducting schools in The Netherlands, Slovenia, Italy, Germany, Spain and Portugal. In recognition of his musical and cultural merit, he was nominated as “Officer of the Order of Orange-Nassau” by Queen Beatrix from The Netherlands.

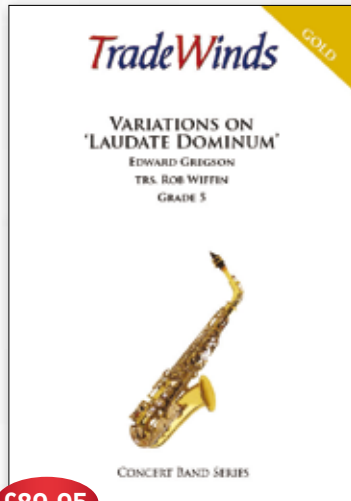

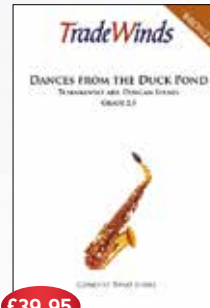

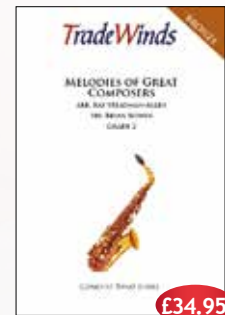

On Thursday and Saturday, boats with various forms of wind music cruise the waters of the Oudegracht in the Utrecht's historic city center. The boats depart from the terrace of TivoliVredenburg and sail to Ledig Erf via Bemuurde Weerd and Oudegracht. From there, they sail back to TivoliVredenburg. The following bands & ensembles from Utrecht and surrounding areas are performing.

Town Band Wilhelmina Herwijnen (Lingewaal)

This town band is part of the Muziekvereniging Wilhelmina music society. This society consists of a fanfare orchestra and a student orchestra and is led by conductor Ron van Duffelen.

Town Band Hofrakkers (Gilze en Rijen)

This town band has existed for over 26 years and performs festive music as well as a more sober repertoire.

Town Band De BluZZers (Utrecht)

The broad repertoire of the BluZZers ranges from carnival music to Dixieland jazz and chansons.

Brass Band Amersfoort (Amersfoort)

Brass Band Amersfoort was founded in 1975 and is the 'British style' brass band of Amersfoort and its surroundings. Because the societies strive to play for the widest possible audiences, a fringe program has been realized. This program offers musicians the chance to perform at public locations. 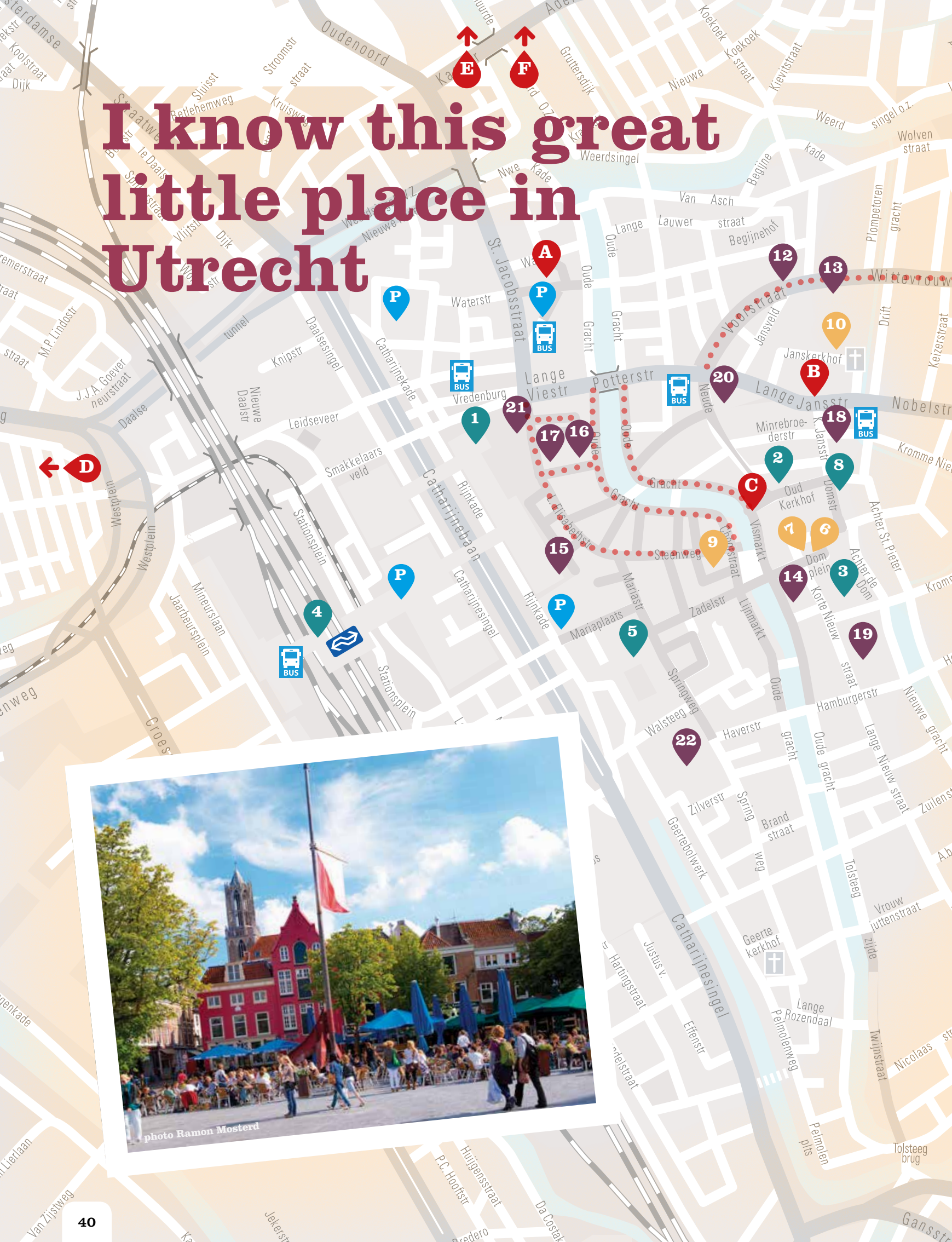
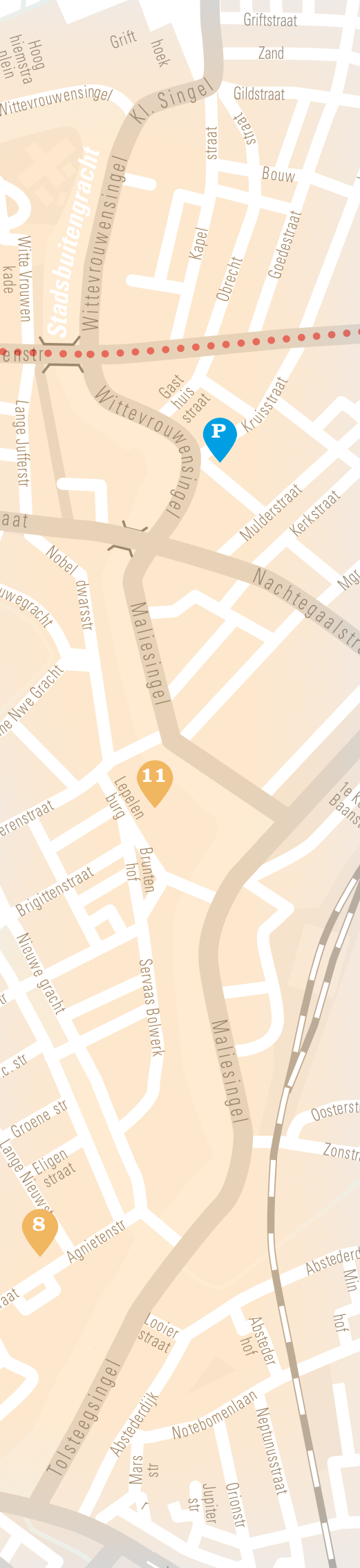

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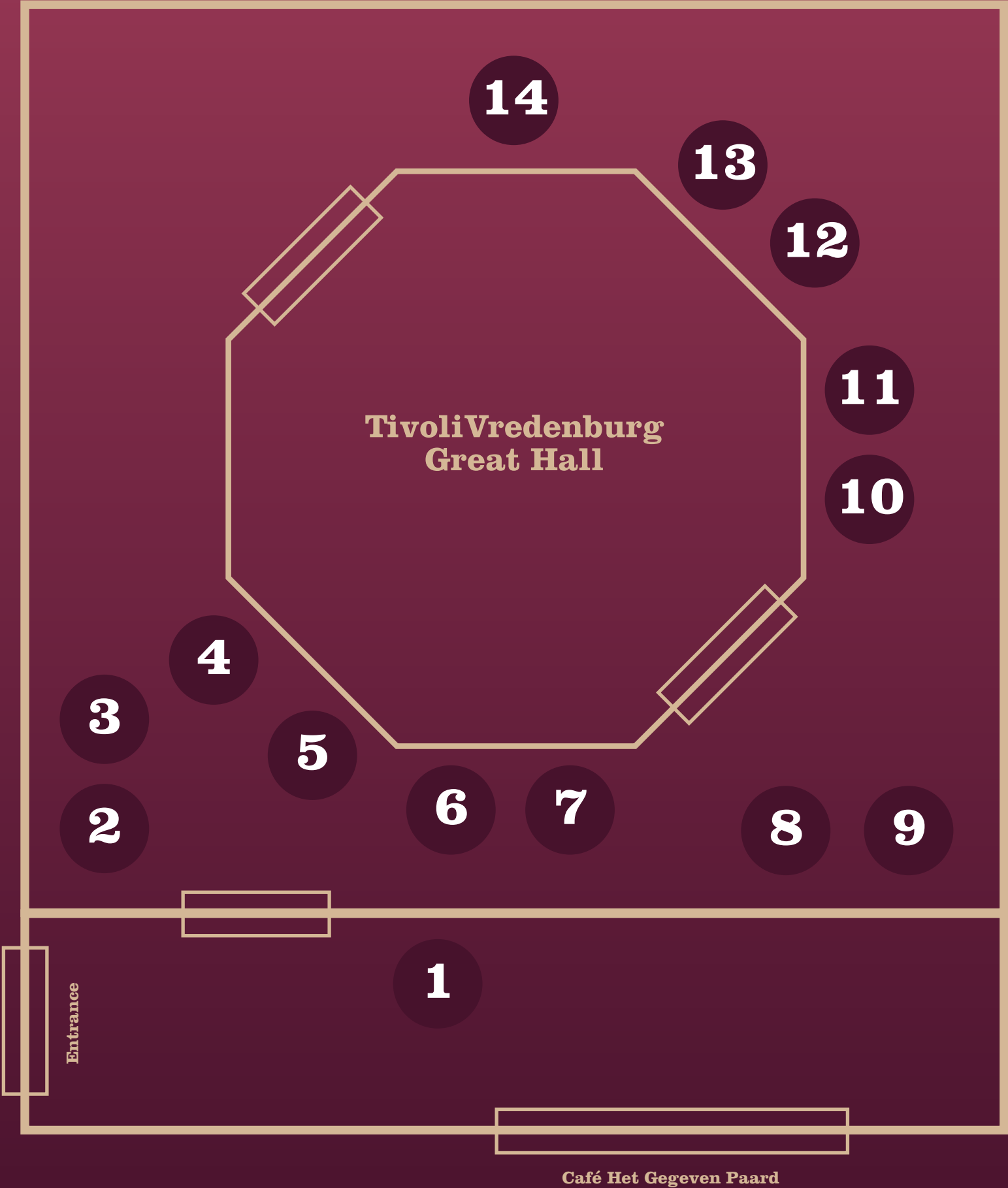

All repertoire sessions, presentations of papers and conducting masterclasses will take place in the Conservatory of Utrecht, which is part of HKU University of the Arts.

Heart of the conservatory is the J.M. Fentener Van Vlissingenzaal, the oldest concert hall of The Netherlands. It has 221 seats, of which 44 of them are located on the balcony. The hall is built on the foundations of the former Maria Church: you can still clearly recognize the choir. In 1987 it was hit by a fire and rebuilt. The interior features colorful panels by artist Peter Struycken.

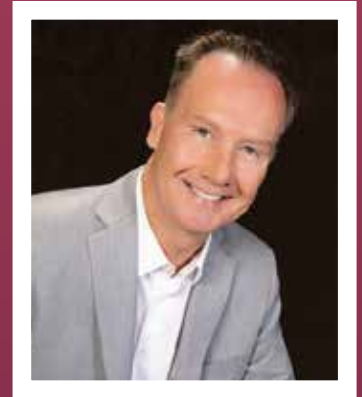

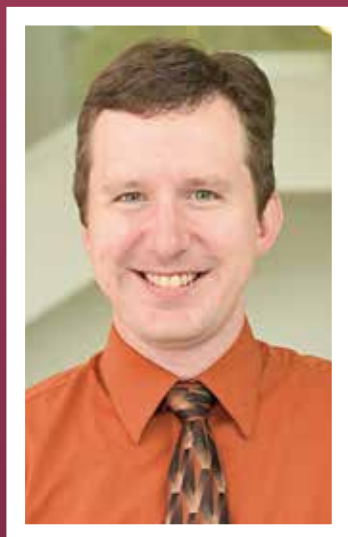

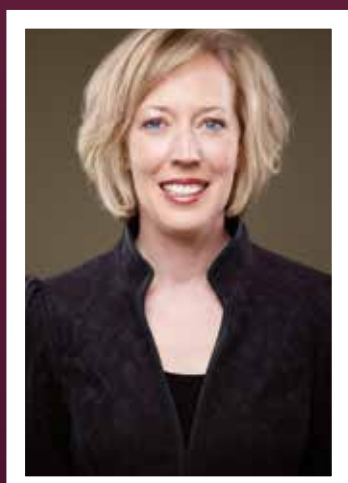
and more European in style, with a big influence of the American way of orchestration.
